

Dixon City Commission
Regular Session
Monday, December 13, 2021, 6pm

Dixon City Commission met in session Monday, December 13, 2021, 6 p.m. Attending were Mayor Carolyn Townsend, Commissioners Terry Webb, Randy Norman, Dorris Crowley, and Jeff Graham, City Attorney Ben Leonard, and City Clerk Barbara Goff.

Minutes were approved on a motion by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes.

Bills were approved on a motion by Commissioner Crowley, seconded by Commissioner Webb, all ayes.

Water loss this month is at 4%.

The delinquent water account discussed at last month's meeting was updated: the current bill plus amount of monthly payment plan was received following disconnection.

Members of Dixon Fire Department have been to Dawson Springs to help with search and recovery after a tornado hit the area recently. The City is waiting on the call to send a Public Works employee to assist in cleanup efforts.

Commissioner Norman made a motion to allow Mayor Townsend to appear at City meetings by Zoom during a months-long vacation to Florida, seconded by Commissioner Crowley, all ayes.

A first reading of a budget amendment for fiscal year 2021-22 due to receipt of a third round of CARES funds was approved on a motion by Commissioner Graham, seconded by Commissioner Webb, all ayes.

A resolution allowing the City to apply for a Cybersecurity Grant with Kentucky League of Cities, and authorizing Mayor Townsend and City Clerk Goff to administer the funds, was approved on a motion by Commissioner Norman, seconded by Commissioner Webb, all ayes.

A resolution allowing the City to purchase a CL-17 Chlorine Analyzer using ARPA funds was approved on a motion by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes.

Due to injuries obtained in a vehicle accident at her full time job, Code Enforcement Officer Sondra Norman will be stepping down from her position with the City, with the stipulation she may be allowed to return to the position should the approval of disability allow. Commissioner Crowley made a motion for the City to advertise to hire for the position of Code Enforcement Officer, seconded by Commissioner Webb, all ayes. The position will pay \$250 monthly, and interviews will be conducted with the Commissioners as well as members of the Code Enforcement Board.

Residents are participating in a Christmas decoration contest sponsored by the City. Judging will take place this week. The winners will be asked to join the January Commission meeting for presentation of awards, which will be gift certificates from 8 local businesses.

Commissioner Webb made a motion to enter closed session, seconded by Commissioner Crowley, all ayes. Following, Commissioner Webb made a motion to return to regular session, seconded by Commissioner Norman. There was no report from the closed session.

A motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes.
