

Dixon City Commission
Regular Session
Monday, February 8, 2021, 6pm

Dixon City Commission met in session via Zoom on Monday, February 8, 2021, 6 p.m. Attending were Mayor Carolyn Townsend, Commissioners Terry Webb, Randy Norman, James Poe, and Dorris Crowley, City Attorney Ben Leonard, and City Clerk Barbara Goff.

Minutes were approved on a motion by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Crowley, all ayes.

Bills were approved on a motion by Commissioner Norman, seconded by Commissioner Crowley, all ayes.

Mayor Townsend reported the spray park area at Baker Park should be ready by early spring. She has a goal of a soft opening and dedication the weekend prior to Memorial Day.

Commissioner Norman reported the City and the County worked together to restore a culvert near the Senior Center that had been washed out due to heavy rains.

Mayor Townsend reported water meter replacement is still underway. About 60 meters have already been replaced. Matt Cobb, licensed contract worker with the City, is working with Master Meter regarding the warranty amount; there is a ten year warranty on the meters and the ones in our system are about nine years old. The computer for meter reading has been repaired and was operating for the most recent round of reading meters.

The City is currently waiting on Sondra Norman to resume duties as Code Enforcement Officer. Hopefully she will be able to return by spring.


Approval to remove Stone Lane as a City maintained street passed at last month's meeting. A Resolution for the City Road System, updating the current streets maintained by the City, was approved on a motion by Commissioner Crowley, seconded by Commissioner Webb, all ayes.

Due to recent review of City ordinance concerning reconnect fees for delinquent customers, it was decided clarification was necessary. A proposed amended ordinance was presented to all present. Commissioners Crowley, Norman, Webb, and Poe have read the proposed ordinance amendment. A second reading is scheduled for next month's meeting.

Several newly appointed board members have already taken a new oath of office. As no new members were in attendance, the meeting moved forward with the agenda.

Commissioner Crowley made the suggestion to construct a stage area at Baker Park to be used at future events. Mayor Townsend stated the City currently has a portable sectioned stage in storage that is used at events at the park.

A motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Poe, all ayes.
