

Dixon City Commission
Regular Session
Monday, October 11, 2021, 6pm

Dixon City Commission met in session Monday, October 11, 2021, 6 p.m. Attending were Mayor Carolyn Townsend, Commissioners Terry Webb, Randy Norman, Dorris Crowley, and Jeff Graham, City Attorney Ben Leonard, and City Clerk Barb Goff.

Minutes were approved on a motion by Commissioner Norman, seconded by Commissioner Webb, all ayes.

Bills were approved on a motion by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Crowley, all ayes.

Water loss is at 3.9%. There is currently a leak suspected along 132W but Public Works has been unable to locate it. The Kentucky Rural Water Association is being called for use of a listening device that should help with locating the leak in order to lead to repair.

Storm drains have been cleaned throughout the City, as well as fire hydrants have been painted. The spray park has been winterized. City Hall and buildings at Baker Park have also been painted. The building located at the old farmer's market has had metal installed and is awaiting doors to be installed and a concrete floor to be poured. Enclosing the shelter to create the building is being funded by ARPA and will be used as extra storage space for Public Works. A new electrical outlet has been installed at this location as well, with the intention to host food trucks on 41A instead of Baker Park throughout the winter.

Donations from food trucks serving the community at Baker Park this summer have been enough to cover the costs for utilities at both parks for the year to date.

Code Enforcement will be meeting October 13. It was requested for the Code Enforcement Officer to be present at the next Commission meeting as well.

The Webster County PVA has notified the City there is a property now located within City limits but not assessed on City taxes. 80 St Rt 1340 is listed on the Kentucky state roster as being in Dixon City limits but has never been taxed as such. Commissioner Webb made a motion to include 80 St Rt 1340 in billing for City property taxes, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes.

An ordinance creating a \$25.00 insufficient funds returned check fee was approved for a first reading on a motion by Commissioner Crowley, seconded by Commissioner Webb, all ayes.


Trick-or-treating hours were set for October 30, 4-7pm on a motion by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes.

A letter has been received from the Webster County Sheriff's department requesting a donation to the National Child Safety Council. Mayor Townsend made a motion not to donate due to not knowing if the funds would be used locally, seconded by Commissioner Webb, all ayes.

The current ordinance on City sidewalks was reviewed, and left for further investigation. Amending the ordinance may occur in the near future after more information is gathered on who would be responsible for the maintenance and potential liability issues.

A motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes.
