

Dixon City Commission  
Regular Session  
Monday, September 13, 2021, 6pm

Dixon City Commission met in session Monday, September 13, 2021, 6 p.m. Attending were Mayor Carolyn Townsend, Commissioners Terry Webb, Randy Norman, Dorris Crowley, and Jeff Graham, and City Clerk Barbara Goff.

Minutes were approved on a motion by Commissioner Crowley, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes.

Bills were approved on a motion by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Crowley, all ayes.

The shelter located on City property at the 71 US Hwy 41A N (the old farmer's market) has been donated to the City, and will be funded by ARPA monies to enclose to create more storage space for the City's Public Works Department and Park Board.

Water loss is at 14%. There have been multiple leak repairs made, including one on 132E in front of the library that has been ongoing but previously unable to locate the source.

The spray park at Baker Park closed for the season following Labor Day weekend.

Scotty's Contracting has completed the repaving recently approved. The project resulted in a total of \$17,500.00.

The Code Enforcement Board held another meeting regarding the property at 247 St Rt 132W. The owners were presented a bill for the total fine, and given a payment plan for \$200.00 monthly. The owners made a payment of \$20.00, so the Board may again review the case.

A motion to use ARPA funds to connect homes owned by low-income persons to the City sewer system was approved on a motion by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Graham, all ayes. Property owners will be required to submit an application the Commission will review before granting approval for each property.

Funding for sidewalk repair was discussed. KLC is opening Liability Grants, for which the City intends to apply. Also, GRADD is helping figure the City's "lost revenue" to determine if ARPA funds would be eligible to use for sidewalks. The City will seek a local contractor to complete the work.

The 2021 tax ordinance was approved on a motion by Commissioner Norman, seconded by Commissioner Webb, all ayes. The Commission voted to proceed with the compensating rate of 0.130 for real property and 0.1367 for personal property.

A motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Crowley, all ayes.
