Dixon City Commission met in session Monday, January 10, 2022, 6 p.m. Attending were Commissioners Terry Webb (presiding), Randy Norman, Dorris Crowley, and Jeff Graham, City Attorney Ben Leonard, and City Clerk Barbara Goff. Also present were Virginia Gibson, Amy Sauls, and Teresa Johnson, members of the community.

Minutes were approved on a motion by Commissioner Crowley, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes.

Bills were approved on a motion by Commissioner Graham, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes.

A significant leak has been discovered on Burnt Mill Rd, near Teen Challenge. Public Works is the process of making repairs.

Applications for the position of Code Enforcement Officer are being accepted until January 14. It is expected to hire for the position at the next regular meeting.

Commissioner Norman made a motion to table the appointment of a new Park Board member to the next regular meeting, seconded by Commissioner Crowley, all ayes.

Commissioner Crowley presented the winners of the Christmas Decoration Contest with gift certificates to businesses located in Dixon. First place was Amy Sauls, second Teresa Johnson, and third Virginia Gibson.


A second reading of a budget amendment for 2021-22 due to CARES funds was approved on a motion by Commissioner Norman, seconded by Commissioner Graham, all ayes.


The City's financial audit is expected to begin very soon. The City has engaged with Alexander, Thompson, Arnold PLLC to perform the audit.

Virginia Gibson mentioned a section of 132W in need of repair. It was determined the area is maintained by the State.
