

Dixon City Commission
Special Session
Tuesday, November 21, 2023, 12:30pm

Dixon City Commission met in session Tuesday, November 21, 2023, 12:30 p.m. Attending were Mayor Dorris Crowley, Commissioners Terry Webb, Randy Norman, Jeff Graham, and Peggy Poole, City Attorney C. Alex Willson, and City Clerk Barb Goff. The purpose of the meeting was to address second readings of two ordinances, a first read of an ordinance, an insurance claim, and to approve an auditor for 2023.

A second reading of an ordinance amendment to increase water rates, effective with the January 2024 billing, was approved on a motion by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Graham, all ayes. The amendment increases water rates for all customer types in the following manner: increase minimum base rate by \$3; increase by \$2 per thousand up to next 5,000 gallons after 2,000 base; increase by \$1 per thousand every thousand over 7,000 gallons used.

A second reading of an ordinance related to City Committees was approved on a motion by Commissioner Poole, seconded by Commissioner Webb, all ayes. The new ordinance stipulates that all city boards must meet once monthly and follow Open Records and Open Meetings guidelines as referenced in KRS 61.810(1)-61.880, should submit minutes of each meeting within 7 days of the meeting, and submit written requests to the Commission for any projects requiring City funding. The Ethics Board will not be held to the monthly meeting stipulation, but instead will meet as needed, within 7 days of any complaint received.


A first reading of an ordinance amendment to increase the salary of the Fire Chief to \$300 monthly was approved on a motion by Commissioner Norman, seconded by Commissioner Poole, all ayes.


Following a recent storm with hail and high winds, the City's properties have been inspected and an estimate over \$200,000 total property damage received. Commissioner Webb made a motion to authorize the City Clerk to handle and disperse funds related to an insurance claim with Kentucky League of Cities for the storm damage, seconded by Commissioner Graham, all ayes.

Commissioner Poole made a motion to approve Alexander, Thompson, Arnold PLLC to perform the City's 2023 financial audit, seconded by Commissioner Webb, all ayes. This the same firm that completed the City's 2021 audit.

A motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes.
