Regular Session  
Monday, October 9, 2023, 6pm

Dixon City Commission met in session Monday, October 9, 2023, 6 p.m. Attending were Mayor Dorris Crowley, Commissioners Terry Webb, Randy Norman, Jeff Graham, and Peggy Poole, City Attorney C. Alex Willson, City Clerk Barb Goff, Code Enforcement Officer Jessica Veach, and guest Christy Anglin.

Minutes were approved on a motion by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Graham, all ayes.

Bills were approved on a motion by Commissioner Poole, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes.

Water loss for September was at 19.97%. Public Works continues to search for leaks. Commissioners Webb and Poole expressed concern over the City's water rates. It was noted the Line Maintenance Fee, which began just over a year ago, has helped with the expense of maintaining the water system, but it is just not enough. It is likely a water rate increase will be needed; however, no action was taken at this time.

The Park Board met on October 5, and discussed a burgeo fundraiser to be held October 28, and needed improvements at Baker Park.

The Commission previously approved paving repairs on Robert Hill Drive following a water leak repair, and discussed the need to advertise for bids for the project.

Another area in need of repair is the end of Stegal Street, where pavement is crumbling.

Dixon Fire Department completed 18 runs during the month of September.

Code Enforcement will have a meeting on October 12. Code Enforcement Officer Veach is hopeful to speak with a legal representative from the Kentucky League of Cities prior to the meeting, in regards to two ongoing and complicated cases.

Dixon Tourism Board will be hosting a Veteran's Day Celebration on November 4. The event will include a parade, baby and beauty pageants, a live band, food trucks and vendors. It is intended for the Veteran's Day Celebration to become an annual event.

Mayor Crowley announced no bids were received for the property located at 71 US Hwy 41A N, and recommended to the Commission they discuss a plan at the next meeting.

The City's current franchise agreement with Kenergy will expire in December of this year. Commissioner Webb made a motion to advertise for franchise bids, seconded by Commissioner Poole, all ayes.

Christy Anglin announced her new business within the City, A Seed of Hope. She described the business, which is open Tuesday-Saturday from 10a-5p, as a high-end thrift shop, but they also distribute items to those in need. The store's proceeds will be used in helping to bring free legal aid to this area of Kentucky. Donations are accepted.

Ms. Anglin also hosts a radio show and offered to announce the Veteran's Day Celebration on air.

A motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Webb, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes.
