Dixon City Commission met in session Monday, July 13, 2026, 6 p.m. Attending were Mayor Terry Webb, Commissioners Randy Norman, Peggy Poole, Robert Brown and Mandee O'Leary, City Attorney Bobby Murray, City Clerk Barb Goff, and Code Enforcement Board members Sondra Norman and Stace Poole.

Minutes were approved on a motion by Commissioner Brown, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes.

Bills were approved on a motion by Commissioner Poole, seconded by Commissioner O'Leary, all ayes.

Dixon Fire Department completed 13 runs in June.

Water loss for June was 13.4%, a great improvement over recent months. A full system flushing is scheduled for July 23.

Webster County Road Department continues to monitor a growing pothole on Lakeview Drive near 132W. They will place some rock in the area while awaiting patch to be available.

Commissioner Brown made a motion to accept the resignation of Park, Playground, and Recreation Board member Kellie Neal, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes. The Board is scheduled to meet tomorrow and will discuss potential new member recommendations.

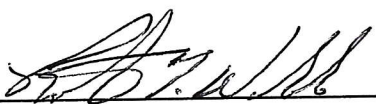
Mayor Webb read a thank-you card from the WCMS ELL students regarding a donation from the City in memory of late PPR Board member Jeff Graham.

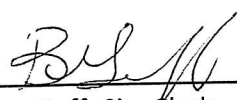
Commissioner Poole made a motion to approve an amendment to the 2025-26 budget, seconded by Commissioner O'Leary, all ayes. The amendment was necessary following receipt of funding from several grants.

Mayor Webb has met with representatives from GRADD who have recommended submitting grant applications to assist the City with funding a water line replacement on Lakeview Drive. Commissioner Brown made a motion to apply for grant funding from the Delta Regional Authority, seconded by Commissioner Norman, all ayes. Commissioner Poole made a motion to apply for grant funding from the Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance for Troubled or Economically Restrained Systems program, seconded by Commissioner O'Leary, all ayes. Both resolutions also include authorizing the mayor to complete necessary related documents.

Commissioner Norman made a motion to enter closed session for pending litigation, KRS 61.810c, seconded by Commissioner O'Leary, all ayes. Following, Commissioner Norman made a motion to resume public session, seconded by Commissioner Poole, all ayes. There was no report from the closed session.

A motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Brown, seconded by Commissioner O'Leary, all ayes.
