Dixon City Commission met in session Monday, June 8, 2026, 6 p.m. Attending were Mayor Terry Webb, Commissioners Peggy Poole, Robert Brown and Mande O'Leary, City Attorney Bobby Murray, City Clerk Barb Goff, and Code Enforcement Board member Stace Poole. Commissioner Randy Norman was absent.

Minutes were approved on a motion by Commissioner Poole, seconded by Commissioner Brown, all ayes.

Bills were approved on a motion by Commissioner Brown, seconded by Commissioner O'Leary, all ayes.

Dixon Fire Department completed 16 runs in May.

Water loss was down in May, at 18%. The new meter has been installed at the WCHS football field, and the school maintenance department has begun work to connect their water lines to the new meter.

A culvert on South Stegal Street was noted for review and possible repair.

Commissioner O'Leary made a motion to accept the resignation of Vicky Tillman from the Park, Playground and Recreation Board, seconded by Commissioner Poole, all ayes. Discussion of a new board member is on the agenda for the next PPR Board meeting.

A new sign for the disc golf course is ready for installation. The Park, Playground and Recreation Board has events scheduled in June and July at Baker Park.

Code Enforcement Officer Kim Turner has mailed several Notice of Violations and Citations to address various properties within the City.

Attorney Murray presented drafts of a purchase agreement and deed for the property at 118 N Stegal St. Commissioner Poole made a motion to approve the documents, which include that the City will pay delinquent County taxes, seconded by Commissioner O'Leary, all ayes. The property owner has agreed to turn the property over to the City as payment of a code enforcement lien previously placed by the City.

A second reading of the 2026-27 budget was approved on a motion by Commissioner Poole, seconded by Commissioner Brown, all ayes. The proposed budget included a salary increase of \$0.50 per hour for hourly employees.

Commissioner Brown made a motion to appoint Public Works Director Matt Cobb as the City's voting delegate during the Kentucky Rural Water Association annual conference in August, seconded by Commissioner O'Leary, all ayes.

A motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner O'Leary, seconded by Commissioner Brown, all ayes.
